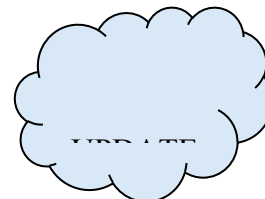

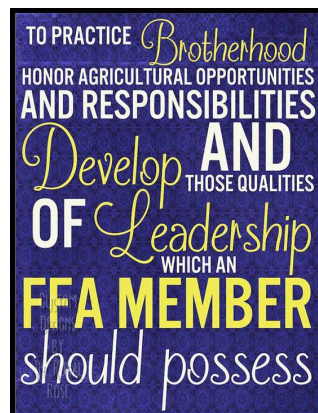

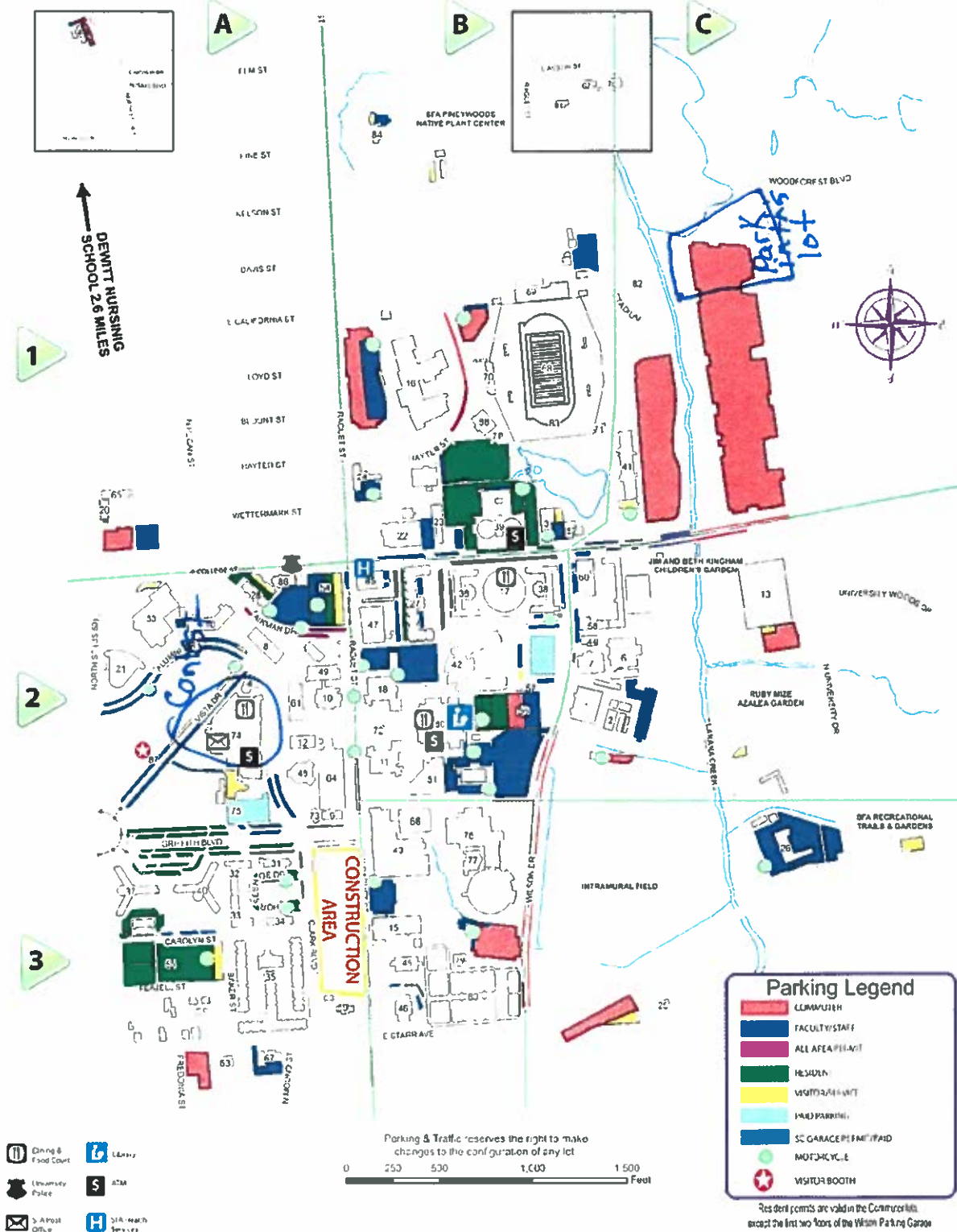

## **AREA IX BENEVOLENT FUND**

**Originated AUGUST 2013**

1. Each teacher in Area IX shall be entitled to become a member and may remain so as long as he/she teaches agriculture in Area IX.
2. Enrollment will be by an annual fee of \$10.00.
3. Each district will elect an officer benevolent fund representative .They will be chosen as needed at the Teacher's Conference. One Area IX teacher will be elected for oversight and recordkeeping purposes, to be referred to as an Area IX Benevolent Fund Coordinator.

5. Benevolent Fund assets are to be placed in a savings account with the Area IX Treasurer, Area IX President, and elected Area IX Benevolent Fund Coordinator, who will serve as trustees.
6. The sum of \$1,000 is to be paid immediately to the beneficiary of a deceased member. If fund balance should be below \$2,000 when a member passes on, their named beneficiary shall receive one-half the amount in the fund.
7. The Area Executive Committee will serve as the advisors to the Benevolent Fund Committee, will review the plan as necessary, and will make recommendations to the area at summer conference.
8. A record is to be kept by the Area IX Benevolent Fund Coordinator and District Representatives, and a copy is to be sent to the Area Treasurer before September 30<sup>th</sup>, along with any money collected.
9. If a member relocates to a teaching position outside of Area IX, he or she no longer retains membership and cannot be refunded any fees paid.
10. To enroll, each member must pay his/her fee and furnish the name of his/her beneficiary.
11. Beneficiary information may be changed at any time by notifying the Area IX Benevolent Fund Coordinator in writing.
12. An updated list of all paid members will be kept on the Area IX website and will be managed by the website manager.

# **THE CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS**

## **OF THE AREA IX FFA ASSOCIATION OF THE NATIONAL FFA ORGANIZATION**

### **ARTICLE I – NAME AND PURPOSES**

Section A. The name of this organization shall be “The Area IX FFA Association of the National FFA Organization.” Members are herein after referred to as “FFA Members”, and the letters “FFA” may be used to designate the Association, its activities, or members thereof.

Section B. The purposes for which this association is formed are as follows:

- ☐ Develop competent and assertive agriculture leadership.
- ☐ Increase awareness of the global and technological importance of agriculture and its contribution to our well-being.
- ☐ Strengthens agriculture students’ confidence in themselves and their work.
- ☐ Promotes the intelligent choice and establishment of an agricultural career.
- ☐ Encourages achievement in supervised agricultural experience programs.
- ☐ Encourages wise management of the community’s economic, environmental and human resources.
- ☐ Develops interpersonal skills in teamwork, communication, human relations, and social interaction.
- ☐ Builds character and promotes citizenship, volunteerism, and patriotism.
- ☐ Promotes cooperation and cooperative attitudes among all people.
- ☐ Promotes healthy lifestyles.
- ☐ Encourages excellence in scholarship.

## ARTICLE II-ORGANIZATION

- Section A. The Area IX Association of the FFA is a chartered area unit of the Texas Association of the FFA which is chartered by the National FFA Organization.
- Section B. The association accepts in full the provisions in the constitution and by-laws of the Texas Associations of the FFA as well as those of the National FFA Organization
- Section C. The Executive Committee shall contain up to nine members consisting of the Area IX: Coordinator, Assistant Coordinator, VATAT President, VATAT Vice President, VATAT Secretary, and the VATAT District Presidents or District designee. The Area IX VATAT Treasurer will serve as Ex Officio. The Executive Committee shall have full power to act and interpret this Constitution as necessary for the Area IX Association.

## ARTICLE III-MEMBERSHIP

- Section A. Membership in this association shall be of four kinds; (1) Active; (2) Alumni; (3) Collegiate; and (4) Honorary, as defined by the National FFA Constitution
- Section B. Each local chapter is entitled to send one delegate from its active membership to the Area Convention. Chapters with an active membership in excess of 50 members are entitled to send one delegate per 50 members to the Area Convention as outlined on the table below.

1-50	1

- Section C. Honorary membership shall be limited only to those who have received Honorary degrees in their local chapters.
- Section D. All chapters in good standing are members of the Area IX Association.

## ARTICLE IV-EMBLEMS

- Section A. The emblem of the FFA shall be the emblem of the association.
- Section B. Emblems used by the members shall be uniform and those obtained from concerns officially designated by the National FFA Organization.

## ARTICLE V-MEMBERSHIP DEGREES AND PRIVELGES

- Section A. There shall be four grades of active membership in the Area IX Association: (1) Greenhand; (2) Chapter FFA; (3) State FFA; and (4) American FFA.
- Section B. The qualifications for the four degrees of active membership shall be in accordance with the State and National Constitutions.

## ARTICLE VI-OFFICERS

- Section A. There shall be two Area Officers elected by each FFA District.
- Section B. The officers of the Area IX Association shall be as follows: President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Reporter, and Sentinel. Other officers may be elected as deemed necessary by the Area Association. The advisors shall be the local chapter advisor of the Area President and the Area Vice President, the Area IX Assistant Coordinator, and the Area IX Coordinator. If an officer cannot fulfill their duties, a replacement may be determined by the Executive Committee.
- Section C. The Area Officers shall be elected annually at the designated area meeting. Area Officers representing Area IX shall be elected following the guidelines set by Area IX Association in accordance with the Area IX Association.
- Section D. Honorary members shall not vote nor shall they hold any office in the Association except that of advisor.
- Section E. Area Officer candidates must be juniors in high school and must hold the Chapter Degree. State Officer Candidates must be at least Seniors, no more than one year removed from high school, and hold the Lone Star FFA Degree at the time of election at the State Convention.

Section F. The Area Officer Election process will consist of three sections. These sections and their percentages will be as follows:

- 40% - Popular Vote
- 30% - Test
- 30% - Interview Process (Interview 15%, Officer Application 10%, & Writing Prompt 5%)

The interview will include 4 Advisors representing each District. (Ideally the District VATAT Presidents)

If an Area Officer Candidate has an advisor or FFA member from their FFA chapter that will serve on the interview panel then that panel member recuses them self from the panel and the next ranking officer will take their place.

The interview will consist of 8 questions, two from each member of the panel and will use questions that are in line with the Texas FFA Officer selection questions (Hot Topic & Behavioral Questions)

The Area IX State Officer Selection Committee Representative will act as a proctor for the interview panel. If this representative has a candidate that is running for a position they will recuse them self and the Area IX VATAT President will serve as the proctor. If the Area IX President has a candidate the next ranking officer who doesn't have a candidate will take their place. The proctor will only ask the questions for the panel and their opinion will not have any bearing on the outcome of the interview process.

Section G. The Area Officer runoffs will include 40% of the officers running. The ranking of the runoff candidates will be tabulated using the Test and Interview Process percentages used in the Area Officer Election process.

Section H. The State Officer Election process will be completed by the Texas FFA Association. The two members of the State Officer nominating committee that the Area IX Association will be responsible for providing will be selected by the interview panel used for the Area Officer elections. The members of the State nominating committee must be at least seniors, no more than one year removed from high school and have no plans to run for a State FFA Officer position.

#### ARTICLE VII – MEETINGS

Section A. Area IX Association meetings shall be determined by the Area Advisors.

Section B. The “Parliamentary Guide for FFA” by Jarrell D. Gray shall be used as the final authority in governing the actions of all Area Meetings.

#### ARTICLE VIII – DUES

Section A. Area IX Association dues shall be paid annually per member in each local chapter. The amount shall be set at the VATAT Conference by a two-thirds vote of a quorum of Area IX teachers.

Section B. No chapter shall be considered as active and in good standing until they pay full District, Area, State, and National FFA dues.

## ARTICLE IX-LEADERSHIP

Section A. Two teams from each district are eligible to compete in the Area Leadership Contest, provided that these schools are in good standing with the Area Association rules.

Section B. Area FFA Leadership Contest Fees:

Every team participating in the Area IX FFA Leadership Contest must pay a \$15.00 entry fee.

Section C. The Area Speaking Events shall be held annually at a designated meeting.

Section D. Judging rules are to be set up by teacher judging committees.

## ARTICLE XI – AMENDMENTS

Section A. Proposed amendments to the Area Constitution or By-Laws must be submitted in writing to the Area Coordinator at least 60 days prior to voting. These proposed changes must, in turn, be submitted in writing to the local chapters of the Area at least 30 days prior to voting and submitted to the delegates in the area with recommendations.

Section B. Amendments may be adopted or revisions made in the Area Constitution at any area meeting by a two-thirds vote of the official delegates present.

Section C. In case of an extenuating circumstance, items of business including but not limited to meetings and voting may be carried out by an alternative method as deemed appropriate by the Executive Committee with full power to act as needed to assure the business of the Area IX Association is carried out.

## \*\*\*\*\* BY-LAWS\*\*\*\*\*

### ARTICLE I

Two candidates from each district may participate in the Area Officer election, Public Speaking Contest, or Talent Contest at the Area IX FFA Convention.

### ARTICLE II

Area contestants for the Talent Contest at the Area Convention will follow the rules for the State FFA Talent Contest. Area contestants for the Public Speaking Contest will follow the rules for the National Public Speaking Contest.

# **Constitution and By-Laws of the McGee Bend District FFA Association**

These by-laws (referred to as the “by-laws”) govern the affairs of the McGee Bend District Association (referred to as the “Association”), a recognized District Administrative Subdivision of the Area IX Association and the Texas FFA Association, organized under the provisions the Texas FFA Constitution, by-laws and policies adopted by the Texas FFA Board of Directors.

## **Constitution**

### **Article I: Name and Purpose**

- A. The name of this organization shall be the “McGee Bend District FFA Association.” Members are hereinafter referred to as “FFA Members.”
- B. FFA Missions:
  - a. To develop competent and assertive agricultural leadership
  - b. Increase awareness of the importance of agriculture and its contribution to our well-being
  - c. Strengthen the agriculture students’ confidence in themselves and their work
  - d. Promotes the intelligent choice and establishment of an Ag career
  - e. Encourages achievement in SAE’s
  - f. Encourages wise management of economic, environmental, and human resources of the community
  - g. Develops interpersonal skills in teamwork, communications, human relations, and social interactions
  - h. Builds character, and promotes citizenship, volunteerism, and patriotism
  - i. Promotes cooperation among all people
  - j. Promotes healthy lifestyles
  - k. Encourages excellence in scholarship

### **Article II: Organization**

- A. The McGee Bend District is an administrative subdivision of the Texas FFA Association.
- B. This Association accepts in full the provisions of the constitution and by-laws of the Area IX FFA Association as well as those of the Texas and National Associations.

### **Article III: Membership**

- A. Membership in this Association shall be of three kinds; (1) Active, (2) Alumni, and (3) Honorary, as defined by the National FFA Constitution.
- B. Each local chapter is entitled to send at least one delegate from its active membership to the district meetings. Chapters with an active membership in excess of 50 are entitled to send delegates to the district meetings as outlined in the formula below: Active Membership Delegates
  - 1 1 – 50
  - 2 51 – 100
  - 3 101 – 150
  - 4 151 – 200
  - 5 201 – 250
  - 6 251 – 300
- C. Honorary membership shall be limited only to those who have received Honorary Degrees in their local chapters.
- D. All chapters in good standing are members of the McGee Bend District Association.

## **Constitution and By-Laws of the McGee Bend District FFA Association**

### **Article IV: Emblems**

- A. The emblem of the FFA shall be the emblem of the Association
- B. Emblems used by the members shall be uniform and those obtained from concerns officially designated by the National Organization of the FFA.

### **Article V: District Officers**

- A. Each local chapter that is in good standing is allowed to send one District Officer Candidate to the District Officer Elections.
- B. The officers of the McGee Bend District shall be as follows; President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Reporter, Sentinel, Second Vice President, and their respective Advisor/s. The Advisor/s shall be the local chapter advisor/s of the District President.
- C. The President and other District Officers shall be elected at the designated District meeting by a majority vote of the voting delegates provided a quorum is present.
- D. The officers of the District Association shall constitute the District Executive Committee. This Executive Committee shall have full power to act as necessary for the District Association in accordance with actions taken at District meetings and various regulations or by-laws adopted from time-to-time.
- E. All District, Area, and State FFA Officer elections shall follow state officer guidelines.
- F. Honorary Members shall not vote nor shall they hold any office in the Association except that of Advisor.
- G. District Officers must hold the Chapter Farmer FFA Degree and be either a sophomore or junior in high school at the time of election.
- H. A member who has previously been a District or Area Officer cannot run for District Office.

### **Article VI: Meetings**

- A. Regular District Association meetings shall be determined by the District Officers, District Advisor/s, Association Executive Committee, and Area Coordinator as to time and place.
- B. District Officer meetings will be held on a monthly basis during the school year as determined by those officers and their respective Advisor/s. Summer meetings may be scheduled by the District Advisor/s, and the District President.
- C. All District Officers will be required to attend all District Officer meetings and the Area Leadership Camp. One missed meeting per officer will be excused if prior written notice is given at least one week in advance. Emergencies and unavoidable circumstances, such as illness, will be taken into consideration for excusal by the District Advisor/s, District President, and the Association Executive Committee. Any officer that fails to attend three scheduled meetings will be considered for dismissal by the District Advisor/s, District President, and the Association Executive Committee.

### **Article VII: Dues**

- A. District Association dues shall be determined annually by delegates of the district.
- B. No chapter shall be considered as active or in good standing unless they pay full District, Area, State, and National FFA dues.

## **Constitution and By-Laws of the McGee Bend District FFA Association**

### **Article IX: Leadership**

- A. One team from each local chapter is eligible to compete in each event or contest in the Leadership Development Event, provided that chapter is in good standing with the District.
- B. Career Development Event Speaking contest will be held annually at the designated District meeting preceding the Area Convention. National rules will be followed.
- C. Candidates for Area and State Officers shall be elected at the designated District meeting preceding the Area Convention.

### **Article X: Amendments**

- A. Proposed amendments to the District Constitution or by-laws must be submitted in writing to the Association Executive Committee President at least 60 days prior to any District Association meeting. These proposed changes must then in turn be submitted to the local chapters of the District at least 30 days prior to the next meeting, and submitted by the District Officers to the delegates in a District meeting.
- B. Amendments may be adopted, or revisions made in the District Constitution at any District Association meeting by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the official delegates provided that a quorum is present.

### **By-Laws**

#### **Article I**

Two winners from each district for Area Officer, Public Speaking Contest, and Talent Contest may be elected to represent the District at the Area Convention.

#### **Article II**

District Candidates for Talent Activity at the District meeting will follow State rules.

District Candidates for Public Speaking Contests will follow the State and National rules.

#### **Article III: Student Officers**

Section A: The district's student activities shall be led by student officers in accordance to policies adopted by the district and its executive committee.

Section B: The elected student officers of the district shall be elected annually from a field of candidates nominated from member chapters in good standing. In compliance to policies and procedures of the district, each of these student officer candidates shall be given the opportunity to demonstrate FFA, agricultural education, parliamentary procedure and agricultural industry knowledge via a written or online exam, present their qualifications to an evaluation committee and appear before the delegates convened at the annual convention to deliver a campaign speech.

Section C: Candidates for student office must be a member in good standing, hold the chapter degree at the time of election by the district, have completed no less than two semesters of agriculture food and natural resources instruction as described by Texas FFA Association membership eligibility policies, have been an active member for the preceding 12 months and have completed all required forms by timelines.

Section D: Officers shall be elected by a point system derived from a combination of written exam score, interview score and student delegate vote in proportions.

Section E: The district's teachers and student delegates shall adopt policies and procedures addressing point values, campaign practices and speeches, committee composition, interview and testing procedures and other such matters related to the conduct of student officer elections.

Section F: The district's elections committee shall consist of the outgoing student officers, with the district's executive committee acting as an advisory committee. The chairman of the elections committee shall be an agriculture, food and natural resources teacher elected by the district's teachers or executive committee or designated by policy. The elections committee and executive committee shall work in conjunction to resolve election-related matters not addressed by these bylaws or by the district's policies and procedures. Student or teacher officers with a conflict of interest may recuse themselves from deliberations or be disqualified by a two-thirds vote of the combined committee. Questions, concerns or appeals concerning the election shall be addressed to the district's executive committee, pursuant to procedures and timelines. All documents related to an officer election process shall be retained in a secure location for no less than 30 days following the conclusion of the district's election.

Section G: The candidate earning the highest point total after the final round of voting shall be declared student officer president of the district, and the candidate receiving the second highest score total in the final runoff election shall be declared the first vice-president. The remaining officers shall be called vice-presidents, and shall assume the stations of the various other offices for ceremonial purposes at the annual convention and other meetings throughout the year.

Section H: If for any reason a student office becomes vacant, the executive committee may fill the office with a qualified member to fulfill the unexpired term of office. If for any reason the office of president should become vacant, the student officer who received the next highest score in the election for president shall become president. An officer who transfers to another chapter within the district may retain his or her office, but should an officer transfer to a chapter outside of the district or no longer be in good standing with a chapter within the district, his or her office shall be declared vacated.

Section I: Student officers shall serve from one student convention through the next succeeding convention and shall not be re-elected, or be eligible for reelection to another student office.

Section J: Duties of student officers and discipline policies related to officers shall be established in policies and procedures adopted by the district's teachers and delegates.

#### **ARTICLE IV: Teacher Meetings**

Section A: An assembly of district teachers shall be convened annually at the state agriculture, food and natural resources teacher professional improvement conference. Other teacher meetings may be convened as deemed essential or desirable by the teacher assembly or the executive committee.

Section B: Special meetings may be called by the executive committee. Except in cases of extreme emergency, 10 working days notice shall be required to call any special meeting.

Section C: Each agriculture, food and natural resources teacher in good standing is entitled to cast a vote in the business of the district.

Section D: A quorum shall exist when teachers representing a majority of chapters are convened in assembly or by electronic means.

Section E: Teacher meetings of the district may be called via telephone conference call or other similar method, provided that each participating teacher is identified by name and chapter and that all delegates may be heard and participate simultaneously.

Section F: Cumulative and proxy voting are prohibited. In election processes requiring two votes, a ballot must have two votes cast to constitute a legal ballot.

#### **ARTICLE V: Teacher Officers**

Section A: The district's teacher activities, fiduciary oversight and other functions related to the agriculture, food and natural resources teaching profession shall be led by teacher officers.

Section B: The elected teacher officers of the district shall consist of a president, vice president, secretary and treasurer. The district may elect such other officers as it deems necessary, consolidate the secretary and treasurer positions and in doing so shall define respective duties and terms of office. All teacher officers serve without pay, volunteering their time and efforts for the benefit of the district.

Section C: No person is eligible to be an Advisor of the district unless that person is actively employed as an agriculture, food and natural resources instructor at a school within the district, is an advisor of a local chapter in good standing with the district, area and state associations and National FFA Organization and is a member in good standing with the state's professional association that represents agriculture, food and natural resources teachers.

Section D: Excepting the student officer advisor, teacher officers shall be elected by a majority vote of the Association's teachers present at the regularly scheduled and posted meeting and shall serve until such time as the district sees fit to elect new officers. If at any time the office of president shall become vacant, the vice president shall fulfill the duties of the president until such time as the district convenes to elect a new president. If at any time, the executive committee determines that one of the other teacher officers of the district is unable or unwilling to fulfill the duties of the office to which they were elected, the executive committee may declare a vacancy and shall have the authority to appoint an interim officer. The district's teachers shall hold an election to fill the said office at its next regularly scheduled meeting.

Section E: Duties of teacher officers shall be as follows:

- (a) The president shall preside as chairperson at all meetings of the district's teachers and executive committee, shall sign all official documents or authorize execution of said documents and shall perform such other duties as usually pertain to the office of president.

- (b) The vice president shall perform the duties of the president in the event of the disability, absence, death, resignation or other inability or failure of the president to perform such duties. The vice president shall also perform such other duties and further duties as may be imposed upon him or her or authorized by the district or its executive committee.
- (c) The Secretary shall make and keep or cause to be made and kept correct records or minutes of the proceedings of the district and the executive committee and shall perform such other duties as are normally performed by secretaries of corporations and such other and further duties as may be imposed upon him or her or authorized by the district or its executive committee.
- (d) The treasurer shall have responsibility for handling and accounting of all funds and property of the district. The treasurer shall provide direction and oversight to any and all who handle monies of the district, assuring that the financial policies of the district and the reporting requirements of the Internal Revenue Service and Texas FFA Association are followed completely and shall present a proposed annual budget to the district teachers at the regularly scheduled and posted meeting.

Section F: The student officer advisor shall be the advisor of the current student officer president. Should the student officer president have multiple advisors, the chapter shall designate one advisor to serve in this capacity. The student officer advisor shall coordinate student officer activities including but not limited to facilitating and overseeing the student portion of the district's annual convention and other student meetings and workshops.

#### **ARTICLE VI: Executive Committee**

Section A: The elected teacher officers, student officer advisor and the student district president or other designated student officer shall constitute the district's executive committee which shall have the authority to deal with items of business of the district in accordance to policies and procedures adopted by the district and to address grievances and concerns submitted pursuant to the district's adopted grievance policies and procedures. Student officers may be excluded from the proceedings of the executive committee in matters which involves sensitive information to which it is not appropriate for students to be privy. The exclusion of the student representative must be approved by a unanimous vote of the adult members of the executive committee and be reflected in the minutes of the deliberations.

Section B: The executive committee shall meet upon the call of the president or the call of any two members of the executive committee. The call shall be reduced to writing, signed by the person or persons making the same and shall include an agenda of the items to be considered at said meeting. The business conducted at each meeting shall be limited to those items listed in the agenda except upon a majority vote of those members present and voting. The secretary or president shall mail by regular first class mail or by e-mail a copy of the agenda to each member at his or her address as shown on the record of the district, in the Texas FFA Association's Roster Management System or other data repository designated by the district, no later than one week prior to the date of the said meeting. The one-week notice may be suspended by a two-thirds vote of the executive committee to address time-sensitive matters.

Section C: A quorum of the executive committee shall exist when a majority of voting members is present. Executive committee members may not vote by proxy.

Section D: Telephone conferences of the executive committee may be called and considered meetings provided that all participating members may participate and be heard simultaneously.

Section E: Members of the executive committee shall not participate in the deliberations or voting regarding items of business in which they have a vested personal interest. Any executive committee member with a conflict of interest shall declare the conflict of interest prior to the consideration of said item of business and shall recuse him or herself from all deliberations and voting. Should there be a doubt as to whether or not a conflict of interest exists; the matter shall be resolved by a vote of the executive committee, excluding the person concerning whose situation the doubt has arisen. Executive committee minutes shall reflect when a conflict of interest was disclosed.

#### **Article VII: Policy**

Policy is to be managed by a committee consisting of 7 agriculture science teachers consisting of the 3 elected positions (President, Secretary, and Treasurer) and 4 appointed teachers serving at large.

1) Management of Policy

- a) Policy questions or changes may be heard by the committee at any time during a special meeting
- b) Policy changes must be communicated to all chapters with a 14 day comment period.
- c) Upon the completion of the comment period, the committee will reconvene to discuss public comment and determine if a policy change will occur.

# **The Constitution & By-Laws of the Piney Woods District FFA Association**

## **ARTICLE I- NAME AND PURPOSES**

**Section A.** The name of this organization shall be the “Piney Woods District FFA Association.” Members are hereinafter referred to as “FFA Members”

**Section B.**

To accomplish this mission, FFA:

1. Develops competent and assertive agricultural leadership.
2. Increases awareness of the global and technological importance of agriculture and its contribution to our well-being.
3. Strengthens agriculture students’ confidence in themselves and their work.
4. Promotes the intelligent choice and establishment of an agriculture career.
5. Encourages achievement in Supervised Agriculture Experience Programs (SAEP’s).
6. Encourages wise management of the community’s economic, environmental and human resources.
7. Develops interpersonal skills in teamwork, communications, human relations and social interaction.
8. Builds character and promotes citizenship, volunteerism and patriotism.
9. Promotes cooperation and cooperative attitudes among all people.
10. Promotes healthy lifestyles.
11. Encourages excellence in scholarship.

## **ARTICLE II- ORGANIZATION**

**Section A.** The Piney Woods District FFA Association is a subdivision of the Area IX Association which is a recognized administrative subdivision of the Texas and National FFA Association.

**Section B.** This Association accepts in full the provisions of the constitution and by-Laws of the Area IX FFA Association as well as those of the Texas and National FFA Association.

## **ARTICLE III- MEMBERSHIP**

**Section A.** Membership in this Association shall be of four kinds: (1) Active; (2) Alumni; (3) Honorary; (4) Collegiate as defined by the National FFA Constitution .

**Section B.** Each local chapter is entitled to send one delegate from its active membership to the district meetings. Chapters with an active membership in excess of 50 are entitled to send delegates to the district meetings as outlined in the formula below:

<u>Active Membership</u>	<u>Number of Delegates</u>
<b>1-50</b>	<b>1</b>
<b>51-100</b>	<b>2</b>
<b>101-150</b>	<b>3</b>
<b>151-200</b>	<b>4</b>
<b>201-250</b>	<b>5</b>
<b>251-300</b>	<b>6</b>

With one additional district delegate per each 50 members.

**Section C.** Honorary membership shall be limited only to those who have received Honorary Degrees in their local chapters.

**Section D.** All Chapters in good standing are members of the Piney Woods District Association.

#### **ARTICLE IV- EMBLEMS**

**Section A.** The emblem of the FFA shall be the emblem of the Association.

**Section B.** Emblems used by the Members shall be uniform and those obtained from concerns officially designated by the National Organization of the FFA.

#### **ARTICLE V- MEMBERSHIP DEGREES AND PRIVILEGES**

**Section A.** The qualifications for the four grades of the active membership shall be in accord with Area, State and National Constitutions.

#### **ARTICLE VI- OFFICERS**

**Section A.** There shall be one District Officer Candidate elected by each FFA local chapter within the District.

**Section B.** The officers of the Piney Woods District shall be as follows: President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Reporter, Sentinel, Second Vice-President, Third Vice-President and their respected Advisors. The Advisors shall be the local chapter Advisors of the District Officers.

**Section C.** The Officers shall be elected annually at the designated District Meeting by following Piney Woods District's Election Guidelines.



- Section D.** The officers of the District Association shall constitute the District Executive Committee. This Executive Committee shall have full power to act as necessary for the District Association in accordance with actions taken at District Meetings and various regulation or by-laws adopted from time-to-time.
- Section E.** All District, elections shall follow Piney Woods District Officer Election Guidelines. The District will follow the Area's and State's elections policy for Area and State officers.
- Section F.** The District Officer Election process will consist of three sections. These sections and their percentages will be as follows:
- 40% - Popular Vote
  - 30% - Test
  - 30% - Interview Process (Interview 15%, Officer Application 10%, & Writing Prompt 5%)
    - o The interview will use questions that are in line with the Texas FFA Officer selection questions (Hot Topic & Behavioral Questions)
    - o Persons conducting interview should be highly qualified.
- Section G.** Honorary Members shall not vote nor shall they hold any office in the Association except that of Advisor.
- Section H.** District Officers must hold the Chapter FFA Degree and be either a Sophomore or Junior in high school at the time of election.
- Section I.** A Member who has been an Area Officer or District Officer cannot run for District Office.

## **ARTICLE VII- MEETINGS**

- Section A.** Regular District Association meetings shall be determined by the District President, District Advisor, and Voting Delegates as to time and place.

## **ARTICLE VIII- DUES**

- Section A.** District Association dues shall be set annually by the delegates.
- Section B.** No Chapter shall be considered active and in good standing unless they pay full District, Area, State and National FFA Dues.

## **ARTICLE IX- LEADERSHIP**

- Section A.** One team from each local chapter in each event or contest is eligible to compete in the District Leadership Event, provided that the school is in good standing with the District.
- Section B.** District Career Development Speaking Event (CDSE) shall be held annually at the designated District Meeting preceding the Area Convention. State Rules will be followed.
- Section C.** Candidates for Area Officers shall be elected at the designated District Meeting preceding the Area Convention.

## **ARTICLE X- AMENDMENTS**

Proposed amendments to the District Constitution or By-Laws must be submitted in writing to the District VATAT President and Advisor at least (60) days prior to any District Meeting. These proposed changes must in turn be submitted to the local chapters of the District at least thirty days prior to the next meeting, and submitted by the District Officers to the delegates in the District Constitution at any District meeting by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the official Delegates present.

## **\*\*\*\*\*BY-LAWS\*\*\*\*\***

### **ARTICLE I**

Two winners from each District for Area Officer Election, Public Speaking Contest, and Talent Contest may be elected to represent the District at the Area Convention.

### **ARTICLE II**

District candidates for talent Activity at the District Meetings will follow State rules. District candidates for Public Speaking and Soil Stewardship will follow the State and National Rules.

### **ARTICLE III - OFFICERS**

If for any reason a student office becomes vacant, the executive committee may fill the office with a qualified member to fulfill the unexpired term of office. If for any reason the office of president should become vacant, the student officer who received the next highest score in the election for president shall become president. An officer who transfers to another chapter within the district may retain his or her office, but should an officer transfer to a chapter outside of the district or no longer be in good standing with a chapter within the district, his or her office shall be declared vacated.

### **ARTICLE IV – TEACHER OFFICERS**

The district's teacher activities, fiduciary oversight and other functions related to the agriculture, food and natural resources teaching profession shall be led by teacher officers.

## **ARTICLE V – GRIEVANCE AND APPEALS**

The district shall adopt grievance policies and procedures consistent with the policies of the Texas FFA Association. Appeals related to competitive events and awards programs shall be resolved in accordance to the Texas FFA Association Conflict Resolution Policy in the respective competitive event or program policies.

# **THE CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE RICEBELT DISTRICT ASSOCIATION OF THE NATIONAL FFA ORGANIZATION**

## **ARTICLE I- NAME AND MISSION**

- Section A. The name of this organization shall be the “Ricebelt District Association of the National FFA Organization.” Members are hereinafter referred to as “FFA members” and the letters, “FFA” may be used to designate the Association, its activities, or members thereof.
- Section B. The Mission for which this Association is formed are as follows:
1. Develops competent and assertive agriculture leadership.
  2. Increases awareness of the global and technological importance of Agriculture and its contribution to our well-being.
  3. Strengthens the confidence of agriculture students in themselves and their work.
  4. Promotes the intelligent choice and establishment of an agricultural career.
  5. Encourages achievement in supervised agricultural experience programs.
  6. Encourages wise management of economic, environmental and human resources of the community.
  7. Develops interpersonal skills in teamwork, communications, human relations and social interaction.
  8. Builds character and promotes citizenship, volunteerism and patriotism.
  9. Promotes cooperation and cooperative attitudes among all people.
  10. Promotes healthy lifestyles.
  11. Encourages excellence in scholarship.

## **ARTICLE II- ORGANIZATION**

- Section A. The Ricebelt District Association of FFA is a chartered district unit of the Area IX Association of FFA, which is chartered by the Texas and National FFA Organization.
- Section B. This Association accepts in full the provisions in the constitution and by-laws of the Area IX Association of FFA as well as those of the Texas and National FFA Organization.

## **ARTICLE III- MEMEBERSHIP**

- Section A. Membership in this Association shall be of four kinds: (1) Active (2) Alumni (3) Collegiate, and (4) Honorary as defined by the National FFA Constitution.

Section B. Each local chapter shall be entitled to send one delegate from its active membership, plus one additional delegate for 50 members, or any fraction thereof, above the first 50 members. A quorum shall exist when at least 51% of the delegates representing at least 51% of chapters in the district are present.

Section C. Honorary membership shall be limited only to those who have received Honorary Degrees in their local chapters.

Section D. All chapters in good standing are members of the Ricebelt District Association.

#### **ARTICLE IV- EMBLEMS**

Section A. The emblem of the FFA shall be the emblem for the Association.

Section B. Emblems used by the members shall be uniform and those obtained from concerns officially designated by the National FFA Organization.

#### **ARTICLE V- MEMBERSHIP AND PRIVILGES**

Section A. There shall be five grades of active membership in the Ricebelt District Association: (1) Discovery FFA (2) Greenhand FFA (3) Chapter FFA (4) State FFA and (5) American FFA Degree.

Section B. The qualifications for the five degrees of active membership shall be in accord with the Area, State, and National FFA Constitutions.

#### **ARTICLE VI- OFFICERS**

Section A. Each Chapter within the District is entitled to have one District, one Area, and/or one State officer candidate.

Section B. The officers of the Ricebelt Association shall be as follows: President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Reporter, Sentinel, Historian, and Parliamentarian.

- Section C. The president shall be elected annually at the designated district meeting by a test and a majority vote of the voting delegates. The test will consist of questions from the FFA Manual and the Parliamentary Guide. The test will be worth 30% of the election process; popularity vote will be 70%.
- Section D. The Executive Committee shall be the Rice Belt District VATAT Officers, the highest ranking Rice Belt District Advisor and the Rice Belt District FFA President. The Executive committee shall have full power to act as necessary for the District Association in accordance with actions taken at District Association meetings and various regulation or by-laws adopted from time to time.
- Section E. Honorary members shall not vote nor shall they hold any offices in the association other than that of the Advisor.
- Section F. District officers must hold the Chapter FFA Degree and must be at least a sophomore when elected. A member may only serve one term as any District officer.

## **ARTICLE VII- MEETINGS**

- Section A. Regular District Association meetings shall be the District Officer Leadership Workshop and the District Convention.
- Section B. Special meetings shall be determined by the District Executive Committee with 30 days prior notice.

## **ARTICLE VIII- DUES**

- Section A. District Association dues shall be \$.50 per member in each local chapter.
- Section B. No Chapter shall be considered as active and in good standing unless they pay full District, Area, State, and National FFA dues.

## **ARTICLE IX- LEADERSHIP**

- Section A. One team from each local FFA Chapter will be eligible to compete in each Leadership Development Event, provided that these schools are in good standing with the District Association. State rules will be followed.
- Section B. Speaking Career Development Events shall be held annually at the designated district meeting preceding the Area Convention. State rules will be followed.
- Section C. Career Development Events shall be set up according to the State FFA guidelines.
- Section D. Candidates for Area shall be elected at the designated district meeting preceding the Area Convention.

## **ARTICLE X- AMENDMENTS**

Proposed amendments to the District Constitution or By-Laws must be submitted in writing to the Area Coordinator at least 60 days prior to any District meeting. These proposed changes must in turn be submitted in writing to the local chapters of the district at least 30 days prior to the next succeeding district meeting, be reviewed by the district officers, and submitted by them to the delegates in the district with recommendations. Amendments may be adopted or revisions made in the District Constitution at any District meeting by a two-thirds vote of the official delegates present.

### **\*\*\*\*\*BY-LAWS\*\*\*\*\***

Two winners from the Ricebelt District for Area Officer Elections, Speaking Career Development Events, and Talent Contest shall be elected to represent the Ricebelt District at the Area Convention.

District Leadership Development Events, Career Development Events, Talent and District, Area, State Officer Candidates shall follow the State Rules.

The District Sweepstakes award for the Leadership Development Events shall be determined by the following formula:

- 2<sup>nd</sup> place team---9 points
- 3<sup>rd</sup> place team---8 points
- 4<sup>th</sup> place team---7 points

- 6<sup>th</sup> place team---5 points
- 7<sup>th</sup> place team---4 points
- 8<sup>th</sup> place team---3 points
- 9<sup>th</sup> place team---2 points
- 10<sup>th</sup> place team---1 point

- Section B. Each local chapter is entitled to send one delegate from its active membership to the District Meetings. Chapters with an active membership in excess of 50 are entitled to send one delegate per 50 members to the District Meetings as outlined in the formula below:

 Section B. Qualifications for four Degrees of Active membership shall be in accord with Area, State, and National Constitution.

#### ARTICLE VI – OFFICERS

- Section A. District Officer Candidates shall be selected from FFA Chapters within the District.  
 Section B. The officers of the Sam Houston District Association shall be as follows:  
 President, Vice-president, Secretary, Treasurer, Reporter, Sentinel, 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice-president,  
 3<sup>rd</sup> Vice-president, and two Advisors. The advisors shall be the local chapter advisor of the  
 District President and the District Vice-president.  
 Section C. The District Officers, Area Officer Candidates, and State Officer Candidates representing the  
 Sam Houston District shall be elected annually at the designated district meeting following  
 guidelines set by the District Executive Committee and approved by Agriculture Science  
 Teachers at the District Meeting.  
 Section D. Honorary members shall not vote nor shall they hold any office in the Association except that of  
 advisor.  
 Section E. District Officers must hold the Degree of Chapter FFA when elected and must be a Junior or  
 Senior while serving as a District Officer and may only serve one term.  
 Section F. A member may not serve as District Officer and Area Officer concurrently.

#### ARTICLE VII – MEETINGS

- Section A. District Association meetings shall be determined by the District VATAT Officers and the  
 District FFA Officers' Advisors.  
 Section B. The "Parliamentary Guide for FFA" by Jarrell D. Gray shall be used as the final authority in  
 governing the actions of all District Meetings.

#### ARTICLE VIII – DUES

- Section A. District Association dues shall be paid annually per member in each local chapter. The amount  
 shall be set at the VATAT Conference by a two-thirds vote of a quorum of Sam Houston District  
 teachers.  
 Section B. No chapter shall be considered as active and in good standing unless they pay full District, Area,  
 State, and National dues.

#### ARTICLE IX – LEADERSHIP

- Section A. One team from each local FFA chapter in each event or contest is eligible to compete in the  
 District Leadership Contest, provided that these schools are in good standing with District  
 Association rules.  
 Section B. The District Speaking Events shall be held annually at the designated meeting.  
 Section C. State and/or National Rules shall be followed for all District Competitions.

#### ARTICLE X – AMENDMENTS

- Section A. Proposed amendments to the District Constitution or By – Laws must be submitted in writing to  
 the Area Coordinator at least 60 days prior to voting. These proposed changes must in turn be  
 submitted in writing to the local chapters of the District at least 30 days prior to voting and  
 submitted to the delegates in the district with recommendations.

Section B. Amendments may be adopted or revisions made in the District Constitution at any district meeting by a two-thirds vote of the official delegates present.

Section C. In case of an extenuating circumstance, items of business including but not limited to meetings and voting may be carried out by an alternative method as deemed appropriate by the Executive Committee with full power to act as needed to assure the business of the Sam Houston District Association is carried out.

## BY – LAWS

### ARTICLE I

Two winners may represent the District for State Officer Election, Area Officer Election, Public Speaking Contest, and Talent Contest at the Area Convention or respective Area Meeting.

### ARTICLE II

District candidates for FFA Talent Contests at the District Meeting will follow the rules for the State FFA Talent Contest. District candidates for Public Speaking Contest will follow the rules for the National Public Speaking Contest.
